

RESOLUTION 142-22: APPROVING SETTLEMENT OF PENDING TAX ASSESSMENT LITIGATION WITH BRACEYOURSELF II, LLC

Councilwoman Linson offered the Resolution and moved its adoption. Seconded by Councilman Johnson to wit:

WHEREAS, there is currently tax assessment litigation pending between the Assessor of the Town of Walworth and the Gananda Central School District and Braceyourself II, LLC in the New York State Supreme Court, Wayne County, for the 2016 tax assessment year (Index No. 79861), the 2017 tax assessment year (Index No. 81182), and the 2018 tax assessment year (Index No. CV082869) entitled *Braceyourself II, LLC v. Assessor of the Town of Walworth, Dennine Lesson, and the Gananda Central School District,* relating to property located at 1205-1215 Mayberry Place, Macedon, New York 14502 (tax identification #84.18-1-6.111) (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, the aforesaid tax assessment proceedings are hereinafter referred to as the "Litigation"; and

WHEREAS, the Property was assessed at \$774,300 on the 2016, 2017, 2018, 2018, 2019, and 2020 assessment rolls, and at \$533,400 on the 2021 and 2022 assessment rolls; and

WHEREAS, after reviewing all documentation, the assessor and Boylan Code, LLP ("Town Special Counsel") recommend to the Town Board that the Litigation be settled; and

WHEREAS, it is proposed that, in settlement of the Litigation, the Litigation shall be discontinued, conditioned on compliance with the terms of the settlement; and

WHEREAS, it is proposed that, in settlement of the Litigation, the Town reduce the assessment of the Property in the following assessments:

2019 Assessment: \$625,000 2020 Assessment: \$625,000; and

WHEREAS, it is proposed that, in settlement of the Litigation, a refund shall be paid by the Town of Walworth, County of Wayne, and the Gananda Central School District on the reduced 2019 and 2020 assessments of the Property within 60 days from receipt of the Demand for Refund, and that interest shall only be owed on the refunds to the extent such refunds are not paid within the aforesaid time period; and

WHEREAS, it is proposed that, in settlement of the Litigation, the provisions of RPTL § 727 shall apply to the assessments of the Property, which shall be \$533,400 for the 2023, 2024, and 2025 assessment rolls; now it is therefore

RESOLVED that settlement of the Litigation on all of the terms set forth above, including the reduction of the assessment of Property to \$625,000 on the 2019 and 2020 assessment rolls; payment of a refund on the reduction of the 2019 and 2020 assessments of the Property, and application of the provisions of RPTL § 727 to the assessments of the Property for the 2023, 2024, and 2025 assessment rolls, is hereby approved; and it is further

RESOLVED that Town Special Counsel may seek Court approval for the aforesaid settlement; and it is further

RESOLVED that Town Special Counsel is authorized to execute all documents necessary to effectuate the referenced settlement.
