THIS AGREEMENT, made this day of 202. Pursuant to the provisions of Sections 115 and 116 of the Agriculture and Markets Law, by and between the Town of Walworth, a municipal corporation in the State of New York, party of the first part, and the Wayne County Humane Society, a corporation organized and existing pursuant to the Not-For-Profit Compy Humane Society, a corporation and having its office and principal place of business at 1475 County Human Road, Lyons, New York, party of the second part, WITNESSETH:

FIRST: The party of the second part, in consideration of the payment to it by the party of the first part of the sums of money to be paid in the manner and at the times hereinafter particularly described, hereby covenants and agrees that:

- 1. The party of the second part will provide and maintain a shefter for animals in such shefter and will humanely esthanized or make available for adoption seized domestic animals not redeemed as provided in Article 7 of the Agriculture and Markets Law. Such shefter shall at all times during the term hereof be under the care and charge of a competent employee and shall be open to the public at reasonable hours.
- 2. The party of the second part will not harn domestic animals away from the shelter if brought to the shelter by individuals from a contracting Town/Village. The dog control officer will be notified when dog turnovers are made. The shelter personnel will require a DL18 at this time. The dog control officer will be given pertinent information on the dog and the person making the hornovers.
- The party of the second part will follow the provisions of Article 7 of the Agriculture and Markets Law and any rules and regulations promulgated pursuant thereof in relation to the holding, care, adoption, licensing, redemption and disposition of seized animals.
- 4. The party of the second part will file and maintain a complete record of any turn over and subsequent disposition of any dog in the manner prescribed by the Commissioner of Agriculture and Markets as well as any other records required by Article 7.
- 5. The party of the first part will control its impound feet.

SECOND: In consideration of the performance by the party of the accord part of the terms of this Agreement, the party of the first part hereby agrees to pay the party of the second part in accordance with the attailant selectable of charges, whenever applicable, as he billed and payable on a monthly basis. Injured animals brought in by a DCO or any duly authorized Town-Village officer of the party of the first part must be seen and treated by a veterinarian before being left with the party of the second part and be accompanied with veterinarian instructions for care. Party of the first part is responsible for veterinary bills in all cases.

This Agreement shall commence on <u>January 1, 2024</u> and be terministed either upon 30 days written notice by one of the parties to the other or upon the signing of a new Agreement by the parties.





RESOLUTION -23: TO DISCONTINUE THE TOWN CONTRIBUTION TOWARD PART-TIME EMPLOYEE BENEFITS

Council offered the following Resolution and moved its adoption. Seconded by

Council to wit:

WHEREAS, Health care benefit costs have increased substantially the past several years; and

WHEREAS, the Town wishes to meet staffing needs in the most efficient and fiscally sound manner possible; and

WHEREAS, the Town wishes to control benefits expense as best it can by no longer paying any part of health or dental coverage for Part-time employees; and

WHEREAS, there are currently no part-time employees enrolled in health care coverage for 2024 and only one part-time employee enrolled in the dental plan for 2024;

NOW, THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Walworth will no longer contribute to health or dental premiums for part-time employees, beginning January 1, 2024. Part-time employees may enroll in any Town offered plan but will be responsible for the full premium amount through payroll deduction.

The one part-time employee, enrolled in the dental plan for 2024, will be grandfathered for the 2024 calendar year, after which time, they will be responsible for the full premium amount.
